INTRODUCTION by Carol Mew

I became disabled a decade ago and found myself coming to terms not only with the physical and emotional impact of my situation but with the seemingly awesome task of re-organising most of my life. Fuelled by my natural nosiness, I set about rooting out the information that would be needed in my new life.

As disabled people and their carers will know, there is no clear place to start. I wrote this 'Survival Guide' to provide at least the basic information needed, so that people less mobile than I, do not have to start from scratch.

The original notion of the 'Survival Guide' was the idea of Dominique Joyeux who produced the first brochure in 1990. I have used his original guide and the substantial information gathered by Disability Resource Centre, to bring together the many helping organisations that follow.
